- d) You assure the woman of the great care that is taken to prevent staph infections. You also tell her some tips, and ways to reduce her risks while she is with us.
- e) You suggest this woman seek the care she needs at another facility, since you know that there has been at least one case of a staph infection. You explain that we cannot give an absolute guarantee.
